

UK School Games – Twitter/Facebook

Guidelines for usage

The UK School Games have created two online groups which will allow participants, volunteers and supporters involved with the event to keep up-to-date with news and debate. The Facebook¹ fan page allows members to receive relevant information about the event. A UK School Games Twitter² account has been set up to allow members to view news regarding the UK School Games ambassador, the event, squad announcements and links to relevant websites. It will also allow users to use it as a forum to discuss the UK School Games and have any questions answered from the event organisers.

As well as complying with Twitter and Facebook's Terms and Conditions, please see the guidelines below.

1. You [the user] must not use inappropriate or offensive language on either site.
2. You must not abuse, harass, threaten, impersonate or intimidate other users.
3. You are responsible for any activity that occurs under your screen name in these groups.
4. You must not transmit any worms or viruses or any code of a destructive nature.
5. You must not modify, adapt or hack either group.
6. You must not use any group for any illegal or unauthorised purposes.
7. You are solely responsible for your conduct and any date, text, information, screen names, profiles, graphics, audio and video clips, url addresses that you submit.
8. You must be 13 years or older to use either group.
9. We [UK School Games] reserve the right to modify or terminate the service for any reason, without notice at any time.
10. We reserve the right to delete any unwanted messages or members on either site.
11. We reserve the right to refuse initial membership to either group to anyone for any reason at any time
12. We reserve the right to report any criminal behaviour to the appropriate authorities.

Violation of any of these guidelines will result in the termination of your membership to the UK School Games groups and may result in disciplinary action.
